WHAT IS ENVIRO-STORIES?

Enviro-Stories provides an educational experience for the purpose of creating school readers that have been written and illustrated about local issues by kids. Students involved in this program will create 15-page storybooks about some of the feral animals in the Northern Agricultural Region. These books will be published, printed and posted online to be read by thousands of people around the world.



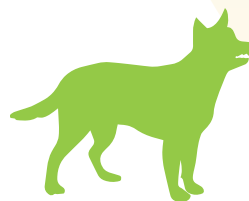
WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO?
