
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Seven years ago, in a dark and dingy science lab, Edwina was studying her favourite insect, the 'leaf insect'.

She set out to find some leaf insects.




Edwina struggled through vines and branches.

"Can we please be friends Edwina?" said Lily.


"Of course we can be friends," said Edwina.

"Lily, I was wondering if you would like to come and live with me at Trangie Agricultural Research Station?" asked Edwina.






"I am really sorry, but I can't leave. If I leave I won't be able to reproduce. I'll also have to leave my family and all of my leaf insect friends," said Lily.
