
Poor Sting was left out once again by his relatives.



Dangerously, Sting flew over towards a beehive under a big tree. He felt that he did not belong with the wasps.




The bees guarding the front door of the hive gave him a suspicious look. As he was a very small wasp they took him through to see the Queen. Sting bravely went through the dark entrance.

"Excuse me Miss Buzzy," said Sting in a trembling voice.


"WHAT!" snapped Buzzy.

The Warlord was mad at Sting, but enraged at Buzzy. She had gotten angry at Sting for no good reason.






The Wasp Warlord was so furious that he declared war on the bees and prepared for battle.

The bees turned around and started shooting at the wasps with their sap guns, for Buzzy was still inside.


