








A class of students came down to Billy Creek to learn about the environment. There was a smart little girl named Bella and she noticed that a platypus was struggling for his life.












The teacher told her students how precious these beautiful animals are.

Everyone was lucky they were able to see them as they are very shy creatures.






So just remember to never, ever litter as it harms the habitats of our unique monotremes.
