He flew over a farm searching for something else to eat.


Rambo spied something on the ground and dived down to investigate. It smelled tasty but he didn't know what it was. He decided to try it anyway.

"The people put them out to try and poison us foxes," Freddy explained. "It will kill you if you eat it."






"You must be Rambo. You are one of the few surviving wedge-tailed eagles in this area," said Fred.



"You of all creatures should never eat one of these or your species will die out and become extinct," warned Fred.




"Thank you for the warning," said Rambo, "It's been nice meeting you, Fred. I should be on my way home."

He started by telling Po the possum.




Rambo warned all his friends about the fox bait.
