At night they huddled together and slept soundly.




One morning they awoke to the shock of their lives. The water level had dropped. If the water storage kept losing water at this rate their would soon be only a small puddle left.

"Look!" said Bessie, the youngest Brolga.







The next day they decided to go for a walk to see whether conditions had improved at Brontes family's old home.

The dog seemed excited by something but did not seem to want to attack them. It barked, howled and yapped jumping around as if it was trying to tell them something.






Suddenly Paul the farmer drove past and collected his dog.
