

By reading this book you are learning how to help Jacky dragon populations and protect them from becoming a threatened species.



Meet Jimmy the Jacky dragon, he is sleeping in the warm spring sun. He has just woken up from his long winter sleep. The days are getting warmer in Peel.



As the days get warmer, Jimmy finds things quite hard. There is a lot of competition to find food and a mate.

> He has to find suitable habitat where he can live. Jimmy also has to watch out for predators.



Jacky dragons like Jimmy live in south eastern Australia.

They eat mostly insects. Jimmy loves chowing down on flies, moths, caterpillars, grasshoppers and small beetles.

Their habitats are under threat from clearing for development and farmland.


Jimmy is a rock star and dances to find a mate! He's also very strong and does push ups to attract a female. He thinks his smooth moves will set him apart from the others.


Quick! Give him a poke so he can escape.

Call out to him so he can wake up!




But his home is gone because of the weight of the lawn mower. At least he didn't die.
