

The Catchment Champions books are part of the Enviro-Stories Education Program.



















In 1952 he joined the Walla Walla Fire Brigade. He played sports in his early years including football and tennis.

John Jacob has achieved many things. He has donated blood 273 times, which is an amazing achievement. John encourages other people to start donating blood.

John was chosen to be the Greater Hume Shire Citizen of the Year in 2011. He achieved this great honour because of his continuing hard work and support for the community of Walla Walla.



John's volunteering is just one example of how he has supported the community. John has also been a part of the sporting community for a long time. He was involved in the Walla Walla Tennis Club and the Walla Walla Football Club. He was secretary of the Walla Walla Sports Ground Committee and during his time as a football player, he played 270 games with the Walla Walla Seniors.





One other sport John has been a part of is sky diving. Sky diving isn't a sport for most people, but because John is outgoing and brave, he took the plunge at the age of 60. The dive was a birthday present. What a great way to spend your sixtieth birthday!



John Jacob joined the Walla Walla Fire Brigade in 1952 and he is still a member. He has received a Life Member Badge which represents 60 years of service. He was also awarded a Long Service Medal which is another symbol of his commitment to the fire brigade.




Mr Jacob also received The National Medal. This medal stands for diligent long service in organisations that protect life and property at some risk to themselves. These medals and badges are all examples of his dedication to his work and volunteering in this community.





John Jacob helps to keep the environment clean. He is Walla Walla Public School's General Assistant. Mr Jacob spends many more hours than he is paid for caring for the school grounds. He mows, weeds the garden, carries out minor repairs and is a friend and role model to all of our students. Along with maintaining the school grounds, John helps to preserve the old school house.



Another example of John's great work in the community is his volunteering at Gum Swamp, where they are trying to rehabilitate and preserve the natural environment. At Gum Swamp John helps to keep the area clean to maintain the condition of the swamp. He does this so that future generations will be able to experience and enjoy the same things as this generation. John is always thinking of others.

In John's future he would like to reach 300 blood donations. He would also like to keep volunteering in the fire brigade for as long as possible. John enjoys helping the people of Walla Walla because they can't all do it for themselves. This is something John enjoys and will continue to do for many years to come.
