The Catchment Champions books are part of the Enviro-Stories Education Program.











Judy's Childhood

Judy Furphy was born in Melbourne in 1941. She had an interest and love for the environment from an early age, developed by holidays on her aunt and uncle's farm, where she had a pony, and was surrounded by native birds and animals. She rode her bike to school in Melbourne and life was simpler

than now, with no television or computers.



Melbourne in the 1940'S and 1950'S

Judy was born during the Second World War, so at a very young age she remembers food rationing, and her father in army uniform. Melbourne was much smaller and quieter than it is today. During the Olympic Games in 1956 Judy could catch a tram to the MCG and buy a ticket to watch the games.





Studying at University

Judy attended Melbourne University (the only university in Victoria back then) where she received a degree in Botany and Zoology, then a Master of Science in Plant Ecology. She met and married Roger Frankenberg, who was also studying there. Her first job in 1965 was a nature conservation survey of national parks and reserves in Victoria

Judy's Career

After completing the conservation survey, Judy had a career as an environmental consultant and working as a research scientist on rivers and wetlands. She also worked as a volunteer in Landcare and nature conservation.







Moving to Burrumbuttock


Judy and Roger moved to a farm at Burrumbuttock in 1969 and had 3 children. Judy worked on the farm, as well as in her career, and helped to start Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre.

She is now retired from her environmental career but still works on the farm and volunteers at Wirraminna. Judy loves to plant trees on her farm and watch them grow, which brings new species of birds to the area.

Judy plans to continue doing what she loves, on the farm and working at Wirraminna. She will keep on planting trees and shrubs on her farm and enjoy the birds. She loves having her grandchildren for farm holidays so they can learn to love nature like she did. Judy hopes that everyone will learn more about the environment and help to care for it.
