Feral pigs stomp through wetlands, damaging habitat. Pigs also sniff out the Growling Grass Frogs hiding in the grass and eat them.



Weedy Seadragon

I live in the Gippsland Lakes. I eat tiny animals called plankton. I am special because I look like seaweed.

The Weedy Seadragon can be hurt from nasty chemicals that get dumped into the water.



New Holland Mouse

I live around the Gippsland Lakes area. I eat seeds, leaves and fungi. I am special because I have a really long tail. The New Holland Mouse can be hurt because foxes like to hunt and eat them.



Hooded Plover

- I live on the sandy beaches in the wild.
- I eat small insects that live on the beach.
- I am special because I lay my eggs on the ground.



The Hooded Plover can be hurt by dogs. The dogs either eat the Hooded Plovers or chase them away from their nest and eat their eggs.

Hooded Plovers are an endangered animal as there are not many of them left.



Little Tern

I live on sandy beaches. I eat small fish. I am special because I fly around Australia.

The Little Tern can be hurt from cats eating them or their chicks.



Spotted-tailed Quoll

I live in the forests of the Gippsland Lakes area.

I eat small animals.

I am special because I can hunt for small animals on the ground and in the trees.







The Spotted-tailed Quoll can be hurt by clearing forests and destroying habitat.

We can help protect the Spottedtailed Quoll by planting more trees in areas where they might live.
