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





Ben keeps comparing his cotton to his neighbour's, because he thinks Jack's cotton is better than his.

"Are you okay Ben?" asked Sam.


"Yeah, I'm okay", said Ben in a disappointed voice.

"Yeah", Ben said.




After he talked to Ben, Sam went back to his tractor. He turned on his radio to talk to their other friend Mitch about the conversation.

"That might work but he won't say much", said Sam.





"Hey dude, are you alright?" Mitch asked kindly.

"Yep! We're taking you up to fly over one of the best cotton farms in the area," said Mitch.




Once they were in the air they circled back and flew over Ben's crops.
