She loved to fly over the village, watching the changes in nature.





Each morning, Greta enjoyed playing hide-and-seek in the veggie garden with her insect friends.




The following day, Mac told all his friends what Greta had said.

They decided to make posters to tell all the people in the village how to reuse clothes and toys too.




Every single day, Greta continued flying over the coastal village she loved so much, looking for ways for the villagers to protect the earth.
